Linking Iconic Natural Resources + Public Spaces

South Knoxville has a wealth of incredible natural resources and destination outdoor recreation opportunities. The City of Knoxville, alongside philanthropic and private entities, has heavily invested in these public spaces to capitalize on this unique character. The Urban Wilderness Gateway project seeks to link and amplify existing natural resources such as Ijams Nature Center, Baker Creek Preserve, Fort Dickerson Park and High Ground Park tying together the Battlefield Loop and the South Loop. The future South Knoxville Bridge Greenway and the James White Urban Wilderness Corridor and Linear Park links these impressive spaces to the neighborhoods of East Knoxville and the downtown core. Future linkages such as the G+O Trail and the South Waterfront Riverwalk, paired with improved pedestrian and bike connectivity, would further enhance access to the natural, cultural and recreational resources of Knoxville. These opportunities would continue to add to this diverse mix of public spaces and provide increased access to open space for residents of all Knoxville.

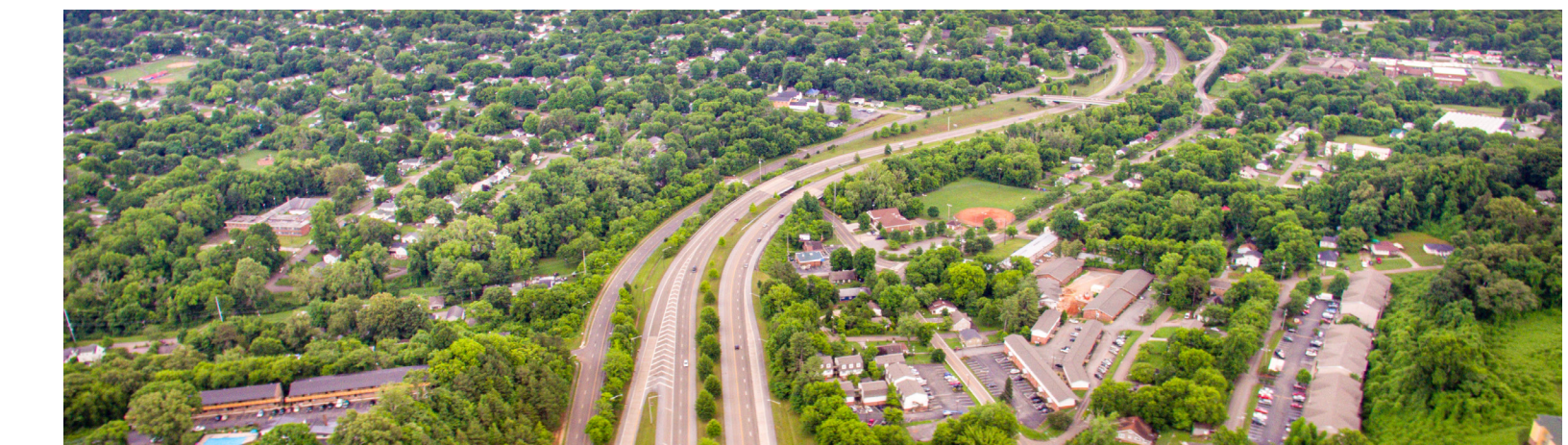
