6. MPC Staff to Recommend Corridor Overlay District

Staff of the Metropolitan Planning Commission next week will propose to the commission a recommendation that Knoxville City Council adopt a new "Corridor Overlay District."

The item will be first up at MPC's May meeting, which begins at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, May 9, in the Large Assembly Room of the City County Building.

The two-page ordinance would create the new zoning district, but each corridor, its boundaries, and its design guidelines would have to be designated separately, corridor by corridor.

The purposes of the district, according to MPC, would include promoting safe and efficient movement of all modes of travel, including bicycles and pedestrians; creating a sense of place that is aesthetically pleasing and environmentally sustainable, and establishing consistent and harmonious design standards for development.

"The need for the ordinance was discussed in adopting the East County Sector Plan in which an Asheville Highway gateway to Knoxville was proposed," according to a memo by MPC Director Mark Donaldson. The city has annexed a number of parcels along that corridor, Donaldson notes. "MPC staff was also involved in discussions last fall with Mayor Rogero and her staff and Councilman (Nick) Della Volpe about potential use of such an overlay along such roads as Washington Pike."

Over the years, there have also been concerns about corridor development and redevelopment along Magnolia Avenue, Chapman Highway and Clinton Highway.
