1. Boright Neighborhood Watch to Meet April 16

Members of the Boright Area Neighborhood Watch will hold their quarterly meeting from 1-2 p.m. Saturday, April 16, at Boright Park, a city park located on Boright Drive one half block east of Whittle Springs Rd.

Meanwhile, Lola Alapo, who founded the group about two years ago, is stepping down as the neighborhood watch coordinator, and neighbor Caleb Wilson will take her place.

Knox County Election Commissioner Andrew Roberto will speak on voter participation and concerns at the April meeting of the Alice Bell Spring Hill Neighborhood Association at 7 p.m. Monday April 18, at New Harvest Park Community Center, 4775 New Harvest Lane, just off Washington Pike east of Target.

3. Learn about Mapping Your Neighborhood Assets

One of the essential tasks for an active neighborhood organization is to take account of all of the assets located in or available to the neighborhood and the organization.

Assets can include physical amenities such as schools, houses of worship, stores, libraries, parks, greenways, and community gardens, as well as "people assets" such as the talents, experience, and connections of the neighbors themselves.

"Asset mapping" occurs when neighbors list their assets and pinpoint them on paper, either on a real map or in some sort of matrix, so that the assets can be visually displayed. Once this is done, it is easier for a community to visualize how to build on these assets for community improvement.

The community organization known as "5 Points Up" and the Knox County Health Department are working together on a model for mapping neighborhood assets. For this work, they are getting help from students at the UT Haslam College of Business and the UT Medical Center's Cancer Institute.

All have been involved in updating and improving the first edition of the <u>Five Points</u> <u>Community Resource Guide</u>. The results of that work will be presented at the Knox County Health Department Auditorium, 140 Dameron Avenue, on Tuesday, April 19, from 4:15 to 5 p.m. Refreshments will be provided.

The students will talk about what they found as they combed East Knoxville to identify assets, and they take questions. Also, <u>Dr. Keith Gray</u> will speak briefly on why the Cancer Institute was interested in this project.

8. Club Dejavu Owners Due in Court Thursday

Criminal Court Judge Steve Sword last week issued a temporary injunction closing Club Dejavu Entertainment and Sports, a South Knoxville nightclub.

Evidence gathered by the Knoxville Police Department demonstrated a pattern of activity that made it possible for the Knox County Attorney General's Office (AG) to seek the closure under a state nuisance law. The action marks the 47th permanent or temporary closure by the AG and KPD under the law.

Club owners Kevin D. Cherry and Kenneth J. Ray, along with Chu Brothers Partnership, owner of the property, were ordered to appear in Sword's Division 1 Criminal Court at 9 a.m. Thursday, April 14, to show cause why a permanent injunction should not be issued.

In the petition, the AG alleged that Club Dejavu "is a business where illegal drug use, alcohol violations, criminal activity, and extremely violent behavior are rampant. Criminal street gangs are openly displaying gang colors and showing gang signs…"
