5. Hunt for Treasures and Boost Online Auction

Office of Neighborhoods (OON) is partnering with Community Television of Knoxville (CTV) and registered neighborhood organizations to present the inaugural Knoxville Neighborhood Treasure Hunt.

Registered neighborhood groups will invite neighbors and neighborhood businesses to donate "treasures" and raise money for their neighborhood organization. Donations can include new items, slightly used items, and antiques. Anyone may donate an item on behalf of a neighborhood group.

Between now and April, neighborhood groups will inventory, approve, and photograph their items to be auctioned.

The Neighborhood Treasure Hunt online auction will launch, Friday, Apr. 12 and begin taking bids. The auction will run from Friday, Apr. 12, through Friday, May 3.
