1. Violence Reduction Expert Presents Findings Wednesday

Author and violence reduction expert Thomas Abt will lead a data-informed conversation concerning gun violence in Knoxville on Wednesday, at 5 p.m. at the University of Tennessee Baker Center Toyota Auditorium, 1640 Cumberland Avenue.

Abt spoke at the Baker Center in May 2022 and returns to discuss the findings of a study that analyzed gun violence in Knoxville from 2019 and 2021. The program will review when, where and why violence in Knoxville is most likely to occur and discuss evidence-based strategies for saving lives.

After the presentation, Mayor Indya Kincannon will facilitate a discussion with Abt, Knoxville Police Chief Paul Noel and Community Safety Director LaKenya Middlebrook. All residents are invited to attend the event or watch the webcast.
