1. The Knox County Primary Is Today!

Today is the Knox County Primary Election. We hope everyone will exercise their right to vote. "Every election is determined by the people who show up." Larry J. Sabato

On Election Day, you must vote at your polling site. To identify your location, visit the <u>Tennessee Secretary of State's website</u>. You will enter your information and it will provide you with the polling location.

Keep in mind that with the 2020 US Census done; some areas in Knox County were redistricted. That means you may have a new polling site that you have not had in past years.

Voters will be asked to vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Review sample ballots at the <u>Knox County Election Commission's website</u>.

2. North Hills Hosts Plant Sale

North Hills Garden Club will host their annual plant sale on Saturday, May 7, 10 a.m.-1 p.m. at 2511 North Park Blvd, the intersection of North Park and Kenilworth.

This plant sale is a popular event for local gardeners who value native plants that thrive in our area. Residents of historic North Hills donate different varieties of hardy perennial plants and shrubs harvested from their own gardens.

In partnership with a local nursery, the garden club also offers herbs, veggies and gorgeous blooming annuals.
