3. Recreation Challenge Grants Due Friday, June 30

The City's Parks and Recreation Department offers an annual Challenge Grant Program, which provides grant funding to non-profit groups with projects associated with public parks or recreation facilities within the City limits.

Funding is available to 501(c)(3), 501(c)(4), and 501(c)(6) status community groups, homeowner associations, schools, Scout troops and other organizations; many groups use a fiscal sponsor.

Recipients of a challenge grant will be reimbursed 50 percent of the cost of a single project, up to \$3,000.

Parks and Rec has been awarding challenge grants to non-profit groups for more than 25 years. In past years, grants have been used for playground equipment, water fountains, benches and landscaping, including trees, gardens and signage.

Grant funding may also be used to promote activities in City Parks and on Greenways. Grants can provide match funds for various fitness classes such as yoga, Tai Chi, or other activities. Passive programming for activities such as painting and birdwatching will also be considered. Approved activities must be on City park properties, and all other rules associated with the Challenge Grant Program will apply.

Applications are due no later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, June 30.

6. Know What's Below – Call 811

Did you know that 40 percent of people who dig into the ground don't contact 811 before digging because they think their project is too shallow to require it? Utilities can actually be buried only a couple of inches below the surface. The only way to be sure you will not accidentally damage these utilities is to contact 811.

<u>Tennessee 811</u> is a non-profit Tennessee corporation established in 1983, whose mission is to act as an advance-notification service to operators of underground facilities anywhere within the state. This organization provides education and notification service to advocate for and to facilitate damage prevention to underground utilities.

Please call 811 before you dig!

8. Juneteenth Activities in Knoxville

We celebrate Juneteenth National Independence Day, the newest federal holiday, which commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in the United States. The name originates from the date—June 19, 1865—when enslaved people in Texas, in the aftermath of the Civil War, were told by federal troops that they had been freed under the terms of the 1862 Emancipation Proclamation.

City offices will be closed Monday, June 19, and City employees will have the day off. City Council voted in 2022 to add Juneteenth as a paid holiday.

Hardy Park for a special Beck Juneteenth Memorial Tribute Service. Sponsored by Knoxville's MLK Commission. Juneteenth Ride at the Bottom Monday, June 19, 10 a.m.-12:30 p.m. The Bottom Knox, 2340 E. Magnolia Ave. Connect with the Bottom and Two Bikes for a special Juneteenth ride. This short, casual bike ride will take you through East Knoxville landmarks before returning to The Bottom for a fish fry and vintage market.

The Crown Pitch Competition Monday, June 19, 6 p.m. Old City Performing Arts Center, 111 State St. The Women LLC and Shora Foundation host a competition for black entrepreneurs to pitch their business ideas in hopes of winning \$5,000 along with resources and mentoring.

In celebration of local diversity and the contributions refugees make to the community, <u>Bridge Refugee Services</u> is hosting an annual celebration of World Refugee Day on Saturday, June 17 from 11 a.m. – 2 p.m. at the Cumberland Estates Community Center, 4529 Silverhill Dr.

The community-wide event will feature international foods, vendors, and information from organizations assisting in refugee and international protected class resettlement.
