New Vendor Registration System

The Purchasing Division is pleased to announce the Vendor Registration portal and the Bid/Contracting Opportunities link has a new look. Although access to both of these sites remains the same, the content layout for each page is considerably different.

In order to do business with the City of Knoxville, vendors must register with Purchasing through our Vendor Registration system, powered by Vendor Registry. In order to receive email notifications regarding relevant solicitations out for bid, businesses must register and identify the types of goods and services they provide. The City may reject any quotes, bids, proposals and qualifications submitted by businesses that are not registered.

Vendors who were previously registered with the City of Knoxville before December 2016 will need to register through this new system but can retain their previous account with the City to view their purchase orders, invoices, and payments through the Payment Portal.
